Title 1 programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement. What is the Parent Engagement Policy?

This is a plan that describes how RMS will provide opportunities to improve parent and family engagement to support student learning. RMS values the contributions and involvement of all parents and families to establish an equal partnership with the goal of improving student achievement.

How is it developed?

RMS welcomes parent, family and community input and comments at any time regarding the plan. This can be done by filling out an Input Card which can be found on the school website, in the Family Resource Room, and on the back of this document. We distribute an annual Spring Survey asking parents for suggestions about the policy, program, and use of funds for family engagement. Parents and families are encouraged to give feedback at all parent meetings throughout the year, including two Parent Advisory Council Meetings (PAC). At the spring PAC meeting, parents and families review, revise, and approve the policy for the next year.

Who is it for?

All families are invited and encouraged to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. RMS will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and families with limited English, with disabilities, and with migratory children.

Where is it available?

The policy is always posted on our school website. A copy can also be obtained in the Family Resource Room and at all in-person parent meetings throughout the school year. The policy is made available to our community. It is shared through the Catoosa County Family Collaborative and at Catoosa Kids Day.

PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

RMS believes that family engagement means the participation of parents and family members in regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring that:

- parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning
- parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school

 parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision making on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child

PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT MEETING AND EVENTS

RMS will host events to build capacity for strong parent and family engagement in order to support a partnership among the school, families, and community to improve student achievement. Meetings and events will be held at flexible times in order to offer all parents the opportunity to be involved. Meeting times will be determined by preferences parents indicate on the Fall Survey, and can be morning, afternoon, evening, or online. Timely notification of these meetings and events will occur through flyers, newsletters, the school website, text messages, and various social media apps including Class Dojo. Attempts will be made to eliminate barriers to family engagement, such as transportation, childcare and translations when requested by parents. Whenever possible, meeting handouts, presentations and minutes will be available on the school website.

PLANNED ACTIVITIES FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

Open House (8/3/23) – Meet your child's teacher, RMS staff, and the Parent Involvement Coordinator. Sign up for Parent Portal, visit the Family Resource Center, and learn how to stay connected about school events.

Title 1 Annual Meeting (August 2023) – Join us to learn about our school's Title 1 program, its requirements, and parent's rights under Title 1 as well as about our school policies, standards, and School-Family Compact.

Volunteer Orientation (September 2023) - Meet other parent volunteers and learn about volunteer opportunities at RMS.

Parent Advisory Council (PAC) Meetings (September 2023 and April 2024) – We want your input! Join us at this meeting to give suggestions about our School Improvement Plan, parent and family engagement program & Title 1 budget. We will also discuss, review and approve the Family-School Compacts for Achievement and our RMS Family Engagement Policy.

5th Grade Transition to Middle School (April 2024) – RMS partners with RES, TCE and GES to help our 5th graders transition to middle school by touring the schools.

FAMILY AND SCHOOL TEAM (FAST) MEETINGS

Benchmark Packets- (Feb/Mar 2023) - Learn how you can help your child succeed this school year. During this whole-school meeting, teachers will share curriculum information and goals. Assessment data and how to interpret it will be reviewed. Learn strategies and receive materials to support learning at home. Important grade-level skills will be discussed. Parents will be given learning strategies to work on with their child and receive materials to support learning at home.

SCHOOL-FAMILY COMPACTS

As part of this plan, RMS and our families will jointly develop a School-Family Compact for Achievement. This is an agreement that teachers, students, and parents develop together that explains how everyone will work together to share responsibility for students reaching grade-level goals. These grade-specific compacts stress the importance of communication between teachers, students, and parents. At the beginning of each school year, input from teachers, students and parents is gathered. Teachers and staff agree on how they will keep families informed and students on track. Students select the ways in which they will work toward achieving their goals. Parents are provided the opportunity to provide input on their role through the Fall Survey. A grade-specific draft is created and posted on the school website and in the Family Resource Room for parents and staff to review. Parents approve the final compact at the Fall PAC Meeting. A copy of the compact is sent home along with a cover sheet, which parents, teachers, and students all sign agreeing to their role in the educational process. The compacts should be referred to at home and will be referred to at school in parent or student conferences.

RMS will take the following measures to promote and support parents, families and community members as an important part of strengthening our school and helping us reach our goals:

 ASSESSMENTS – RMS will provide parents with a description and explanation of the state and local assessments used to measure student progress and achievement.

- Individual student academic assessments results and the interpretation of those results will be given at Family And School Team (FAST) meetings.
- CLASSES FOR PARENTS RMS will seek to provide parents literacy classes, computer classes, and GED training through cooperation with the Catoosa County Learning Center. These classes are free of charge to parents.

- NEWSLETTERS RMS sends monthly school newsletters to keep parents informed of
 what is happening at the school. Teachers send home weekly newsletters that
 inform parents what is happening in the classroom.
- PARENT PORTAL RMS encourages parents to monitor their child's academic progress through the use of Infinite Campus Parent Portal. Workshops or assistance on how to load and best use Parent Portal are available.
- PARTNERSHIP WITH PARENTS RMS strives to build partnerships with parents to help
 children achieve the challenging state academic standards. We strive to educate
 parents about the curriculum and performance standards used in the classroom.
- PARTNERSHIPS WITH OTHER PROGRAMS RMS partners with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource center, or other programs to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning.
- STAFF TRAINING RMS will provide information and training for staff through emails, newsletters, and during grade level meetings on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas for how to increase family engagement including:
 - -The value and importance of the contributions of parents
 - -How to communicate with and work with parents as equal partners
 - -Implementation of programs to build ties between home and school
 - -Reviews and feedback from activities and events
 - -Using the family-school compact in conferences
 - -Results of parent surveys

- STANDARDS RMS (along with all of CCPS) uses the Georgia Standards of Excellence
 as the basis of our curriculum. These standards provide clear expectations for
 instruction, assessment, and student work. Teachers are encouraged to use
 instructional frameworks which include an opening, work session, and closing.
 Pacing guides and curriculum units called "frameworks" are some of the
 resources used to support implementation of these standards.
- TITLE 1 BUDGET Parent input into the Title 1 budget is sought on the website and at various meetings throughout the year. This input is considered when the Title 1 budget is set.
- TRANSLATIONS RMS will ensure that all materials and communications related to school and parent programs are published in a language format that all parents are able to understand. Translations will be done when requested in order to ensure communication with all parents.
